The death of your child is probably the most traumatic, life-changing event that you will ever experience. The Compassionate Friends is an organization of parents who have also lost a child, a sibling or grandchild to death. Each of us has experienced the deep, searing pain that you are feeling now. Each of us has turned to other parents, siblings, or grandparents who were farther into their grief journey for guidance, support and understanding. This is done through our monthly meetings, our newsletter, our website, our phone-a-friend program, our library, our e-mail program and our referral program. Each month families find our meeting to be a safe place where they can talk about their pain and problems with others who are uniquely qualified to understand; bereaved parents, siblings and grandparents offer gentle suggestions or often simply listen.

We invite you to bring a friend to your first few meetings until you feel a level of comfort with the group. Do not be surprised if we talk about the happy times with our children, siblings or grandchildren, the wonderful memories and the various methods we have created to keep them close to us. It is here that many bereaved families find hope as those who are more seasoned in their grief shine the light of experience to help illuminate each grief path. We have no dues. But that was before . . . everything now is measured in "before" and "after." When I lost my only child, Mother's Day changed. Now Mother's Day has a different meaning . . . one that is not as happy as it once was, but one that still reinforces the many years I shared with my son on this earth.

I was considering this strange paradigm, this shift in my thinking over the past six plus years, and I have come to the conclusion that eventually bereaved parents begin to accept the death of their children on a subconscious level. But before that happens, our subconscious minds wage war on our conscious minds and we experience such terrible emotional lows. It's an internal fight for each of us. Along with the fight to survive, to acquire the will to continue living, we are battling internal forces that must resolve themselves. Once that internal war ends, our healing begins. We will always love and miss our children. We will always shed copious tears for no reason. But something inside of us has shifted, shaping our perspective from this point forward.

So, this Mother's Day I will acknowledge my beautiful son, the wonderful life that he lived, the joy I received in raising him and the wisdom I acquired through the gift of my child. We learn unconditional love when we become mothers. We learn foresight, gentleness, joys in the simple elements of life. I will remember past Mother's Days and think of the wonder that is my only child. I will remember him with much love, more than a few tears and a special sense of thankfulness that his life graced mine for over 35 years.

I will honor the fact that I am a mother. Although my son does not share this earthly plane with me, he is forever my child and I am forever his mother. This is a bond that time, space and death do not alter. Quietly, with serenity and peace in my heart, I will mark this Mother's Day doing what I want to do. I will know what that will be when I get there. Live in the moment . . . that's another element of life that I learned from my

LOOKING BACK ON THE GRIEF JOURNEY

It has been 151/2 years since our beloved son and only child passed away from complications due to Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. At that time, we were utterly devastated by this tragic end to all our hopes and dreams for Robin. Although his health had deteriorated slowly but surely as his neurologist in Oakbrook, Illinois had predicted; we had envisioned that our move to Houston with its benign weather would prove beneficial.

All things considered, we must admit that living in a city renowned for its medical community and warm climate prolonged Robin's life beyond the 20 years that Dr. Sullivan had allotted for him, nevertheless it was terrible to watch him experience pneumonia and the ensuing sepsis that caused his death.

We do not know what would have happened if we had not discovered The Compassionate Friends through another couple who had just lost a child and accompanied them to a meeting. The Katy chapter has been our solace, comfort and shoulder to cry on since December, 2006. The meetings represented an arena to share our feelings about our loss without fear of being misunderstood and a place where we can talk about our children or loved ones freely. Only those who have gone through the excruciating loss of such a kind can sympathize and listen to others without judging them unfairly.

We have also found that we have grown and developed into better versions of ourselves by helping others who are not as long in this grief journey. It has not been easy, with many twists and turns along the way but we have persevered to a position when we can laugh again. Now, we concentrate on remembering Robin's optimism and his love for others. Robin always laughed "all the way to the Kasbah".

Grief RESOURCES For Men

Bereaved dads often get overlooked when people offer comfort and solace after the loss of a child. Maybe it's because fathers tend to be more stoic and less demonstrative. But fathers grieve too. Dads miss their children just as much as mothers. Men, in general, seem to grieve more privately, mourning quietly. They may not reach out to others, whether on social media or in person, even when they are really struggling. Helping Fathers Heal (HFH) is a "closed" support group

that provides a safe, secure environment for fathers to share their struggles, challenges and successes in dealing with the loss of a child. We go a step beyond many other groups by allowing the open discussion of spiritual experiences and evidence for the afterlife, in a non-dogmatic way. All fathers are welcome, regardless of religious (or non-religious) background and we encourage very open, respectful dialogue.

Lifelong friendships are often formed and rekindled annually at TCF conferences.

Unique and cherished highlights of our conference include our heartfelt *Saturday evening Candle Lighting Program, sharing sessions, keynote addresses, Healing Haven, Butterfly Boutique, Crafty Corner, Silent Auction, and evening performances.* This weekend of inspiration, sharing, and learning is followed by the Walk to Remember on Sunday morning. *New for 2022, we will be offering TCF Sibling Camp, for younger siblings ages 9-17.*

This year's conference will be held at the Marriott Marquis Houston. Reservations can now be made online at TCF's dedicated reservation link. OUR KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Mindy Corporon is the author of Healing a Shattered Soul. After Mindy's father and oldest son were murdered by white-supremacists intent on killing Jews, Mindy's life purpose changed from guiding people financially to creating space for people to learn about our differences and discover commonalities. Mindy is a Co-Founder of Workplace Healing LLC and innovator of the Human Recovery Plan™ Software Platform, which helps organizations embrace a collaborative corporate culture that balances a head-based environment with empathetic heart-based support for employees affected by life disruptions. Mindy also created SevenDays® Inc., a foundation dedicated to overcoming hate by promoting kindness and understanding through education and dialogue.

Luci Rossi is a registered nurse from Colorado. She has been a bereaved sibling since she was 9 months old, when her oldest brother Doug died at the age of 23. Her dad found a local chapter of TCF and later brought her to her first official conference in 2005. In 2009, loss struck again when 35 year old Tony died from cardiomyopathy. Luci was 19. Luci returned to TCF where she has presented a variety of workshops, sat on panels, co-chaired the sibling committee, and currently serves as a moderator for the TCF Sibs Facebook group. She has worked across the healthcare spectrum from the newborn nursery to hospice, and is board certified in ambulatory care.

John Santoro is President of TCF Foundation and the 2021 Simon Stephens Award recipient. His grief journey began on December 10, 2000, with the sudden death of his 10-year-old daughter, Paula, from a hyper-rare genetic syndrome. He and his wife Pam joined the Chatham, New Jersey, TCF chapter in 2001 and participated in their first national conference later that year. John was VP/chief speechwriter for Pfizer, where he enlisted his company as TCF's first major long-term corporate sponsor. He has written and spoken about his grief experiences in both conference settings and through the popular media, including an essay on grief published in the widely-acclaimed book on leadership, What Is Your Life's Work?



Attending your first Compassionate Friends meeting can be a frightening experience. Bereaved parents are vulnerable, lost, heartbroken and fearful of the unknown. Please remember, each of us was in this same place not so long ago. Bring a friend or your spouse for support to your first few meetings. Someone from our group will talk with you and sit with you as well. We are here for you the newly bereaved. We suggest that you attend at least three meetings before deciding whether or not TCF will help you on your grief journey. You need not walk alone.

A Request of Our Longer-Term Members

Take a moment of your time today to think back to the beginning of your grief journey. It's difficult even to recall the events surrounding your child's death, let alone remember your first Compassionate Friends meeting. Yet you came, and when you arrived a sweet voice soothed your shattered nerves, talked with you, welcoming you and explaining the chapter meetings so you would know what to expect.

Someone was there for you. Many "established bereaved" were ready to give you a hug, dry your tears, hold your hand and support you as you said your child's name for the first time in an open group setting. There was a gentleness and kinship in this room that you would find no where else in the world.

Your unique perspective is needed by the many newly bereaved who enter our meetings each month for the first time. Each of these parents deserves a gentle welcome, a kindred soul upon whom they can rely. Trust is a sacred bond that gets us through the first meeting and perhaps the second and third meeting as well.

Remember who you were and all that you have become since coming to Compassionate Friends. If you can find it in your heart to give back to those who need the security of our group now, please return for them. The gift of hope is such a precious treasure.

In a few days we will celebrate you as you would be turning 31. It will be an Andréa Day, dedicated to you. We honor you every day, but April 16 and July 4 are special dates where it is all about you and only you.

I talk a lot about hope and getting better and acceptance and the work that this relationship with grief takes!! It is all part of what we must do as bereaved families to continue living and getting better, but it can be so draining. There are times where I am totally exhausted by the toll that this grief journey is taking on all of us. I assume that I am now considered a seasoned griever, but seasoned grievers continue to grieve, and the wound never closes.

April 16 will be a good day, but a bittersweet one. So many milestones that you are missing, and there is nothing that any of us can do about it. Love truly never dies, and no matter how long it has been, milestone days are so difficult without you.

What comforts me is your spirituality, and what you have taught me and continue to teach me. The conversations that we had when you were on this earth, the energy you always referred to, the signs you continue to send us... There is no doubt in my mind and my heart that you are always with us. For the last 2,104 days you have been by my side, and you have given me the strength to get better for your sisters and your dad, but also for me. You have taken me on a path of gratitude for all the wonderful bereaved families that have carried us when we were lost. With gratitude, we can pay it forward and help those that need it the most. You have taught me to listen to others, a skill that I did not really have. You have led me to be who I am today, where love, hope, grief, acceptance are all intertwined, where it is ok not to be ok, and it is ok to be joyful and laugh.

Happy birthday in Heaven ma Chérie! There are a lot of people there with you. I hope that you have an amazing day surrounded by love, music, dance, and laughter! We will do the same here on earth! Jason Mraz will be singing in the background, while we cook out in our "Andréa's Kitchen", send balloons to the Universe (yes I know it is not green, but It's your birthday!), eat a cookie cake and cookie's n cream, drink a little whiskey in your honor and probably laugh a little!
